- Being familiar with the covenant God made to his people

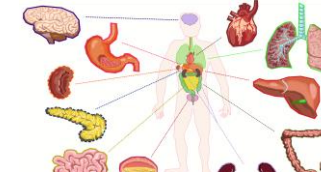


## Science

## Maths

<b>Place Value</b>	Writing numbers to 100, part-whole models, place value charts, partitioning numbers to 100, counting in 2's, 5's and 10's.
<b>Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, Division</b>	Add by making 10's, add to the next 10, add across 10, subtract from 10, 10 more and 10 less, add two 2 digit numbers, mixed addition and subtraction

## Geography

### Spatial Sense

- Use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as the countries, continents and oceans
- Use simple compass directions
- Use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key
- Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.

## Art & DT Murals and Tapestries

- Murals are works of art that are painted directly onto walls or ceilings. Cave paintings are the earliest murals but murals are still painted today. They can tell stories or communicate messages.
- A tapestry is a piece of art made of woven threads. Tapestries can tell stories or contain messages. The Lady and the Unicorn is a tapestry which shows the different senses.
