Key Vocabulary	Definition
Pre-historic	<i>The time before written records</i>
Archaeology	<i>The study of history and pre-historic times through looking at artefacts found in the ground.</i>
Artefact	An object made by a human being that tells us about history.
Bronze	<i>Bronze is a hard, yellowish mixture of metals. People make it by melting copper and tin together.</i>
Shield	A piece of metal, held by straps or a handle used as a protection.
Helmet	A hard or padded protective hat.

<p><b>Woolly Mammoth</b></p> 	An animal that lived in the Ice Age. It had a long shaggy coat, small ears, and a thick layer of fat.
<p><b>Stonehenge</b></p> 	Britain's most famous prehistoric monument, in Wiltshire.
<p><b>Celt</b></p> 	People who lived in Britain and northwest Europe during the Iron Age

<p><b>Ice age</b></p> 	A period in Earth's history when North America and Northern Europe was covered with ice.
<p><b>Stone age</b></p> 	A time in prehistory when humans made and used <i>stone</i> tools.
<p><b>Bronze age</b></p> 	A time in early human history when people first began to use tools made of <i>bronze</i> .
<p><b>Iron age</b></p> 	A time in early human history when people began to use tools and weapons made of <i>iron</i> .
