

YEAR 3

This week, year 3 have started a new writing unit based on the story 'The True Story of the Three Little Pigs'. We read the story as a class and then the children worked in groups of 3 to hot seat the characters. Within their groups, one child was the wolf, one was the interviewer and the other was one of the three little pigs. They took it in turns being the interviewer and asked questions to each character. The children worked so hard and provided some really well thought out and insightful questions and answers.



YEAR 4

In Year 4 we have been learning about computing systems and their networks. This weeks lesson focused on describing content and noticing the features, for example: images, videos, text, logo/title on a webpage.





For the second half of the lesson, we went into our IT suite in the Hobbley room.

Children were asked to make content on the Google Chrome Music Lab maker website.

Each child created their own music and listened to it through their headphones.

There were some amazing pieces of music!

YEAR 5

In Shared Reading, Year 5's have started reading their new class book 'Midnight Fox' by Betsy Byars. We have been reading the book everyday for 15 minutes and answering comprehension questions on the text we have read.



First day back and the Year 5's started their new half term with an active hour in PE with Coach Sakr, focusing on ball games and practicing as well as building on their ball skills.



YEAR 6

The Year 6 children are learning about Textiles in their DT lessons. For their activity, they had to research the advantages and disadvantages of natural and synthetic fibres.
