What should I already know?

- Lent is a time of remembering the death of Jesus.
- During Lent, Catholics remember the events of Holy week; Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday and Good Friday.
- During Lent we give something up (Fasting).
- During Lent, we pray (Prayer).
- During Lent, we help those who are in need (Almsgiving).
- Purple is the colour of Lent.
- The priest uses ash to draw a cross on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday.

What am I going to learn?

- A good deed is an act of kindness.
- That Give Alms is a Greek word which is translated as 'alms' means 'mercy'.
- A Catholic 'world view' requires us to offer financial and practical support to those in need, particularly those who have less.
- In Matthew's Scripture, God gives instructions when carrying out the three actions of Lent.
- Palm Sunday is when Jesus entered Jerusalem.
- Holy Thursday is when Jesus had his last supper with his disciples.
- Jesus washed the feet of the disciples at the last supper.
- Good Friday is when Jesus was crucified on the cross.

Vocabulary

Sacrifice: When you give something up that is important to you.

Give alms: It is the act of giving, showing kindness.

Fast: When you give something up to eat.

Liturgy: The events in a religious service.

Pray: To say a prayer to God.

Scripture: The sacred writings of Christianity contained in the Bible.

Palm Sunday: The Sunday before Easter, on which Christ's entry into Jerusalem is celebrated in many Christian churches by processions in which branches of palms are carried.

Holy Thursday: Catholics remember the washing of the feet and the Last Supper of Jesus Christ with his disciples.

Good Friday: The Friday before Easter Sunday, on which the Crucifixion of Christ is remembered in the Christian Church. It is traditionally a day of fasting and penance.
