

Remote Learning at St Mary's

This information is only to be used as a general guide; parents can expect further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence.

There are two scenarios for remote learning and these are outlined below. The first is where your child is not permitted to attend school and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school.

<p>My child is absent because they are awaiting test results and our household is required to self-isolate.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">OR:</p> <p>My child is not permitted to attend school as someone they have come into contact with (possibly outside of school) has tested positive for Covid-19. <p>My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">OR:</p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Loom will be used by teachers and links for lessons, assemblies and worship will be sent out to parents • There will be opportunities for live and recorded lessons throughout this period • A daily plan will be emailed to parents with a range of tasks which match the lessons that are being taught in school that day; links will be included • Online resources will be included using https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize and https://www.thenational.academy/ • Phonics sessions/tasks for KS1 to work on the sounds your child will be missing • Bug Club books will be allocated to your child so they can read a variety of books and answer the accompanying comprehension questions • Foundation Subject tasks will be sent based on the lessons being covered in class that day/week • Microsoft Teams will be the platform used and children will be expected to upload completed work to this
