- Millions of tourists visit the Maasai reserve each year to see the endless savannah and to go on safari to look at the amazing wildlife such as elephants, lions, cheetahs, giraffes and many more!

Vocabulary

Africa: Is a continent. It has 54 countries.

Kenya: Is a country in East Africa. It has safari animals.

Continent: A **continent** is a large area of the land on Earth that is joined together. There are seven **continents** in the world.

Safari: Is a trip to see or hunt animals especially in Africa.

Savannah: A grassy plain in tropical and subtropical regions, with few trees.

Wildlife animals: An animal which lives in its natural habitat and is able to survive on its own. It is not a pet.

Migration: Seasonal movement of animals from one region to another.

Endangered: Seriously at risk of extinction.

Extinction: When something is no longer around.

Species: A group of closely related animals that are very similar to each other.
