What should I already know?

- Holy week are the events leading up to Jesus' death.
- Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday are part of Holy Week.
- Good Friday is the day Jesus was crucified.
- Easter Sunday is the day Jesus resurrected.
- Jesus was crucified for saying that he was the Messiah.



What am I going to learn?

- After Jesus' crucifixion, the disciples did not leave Jerusalem, they stayed there.
- The disciples and Mary (Mother of Jesus) waited for the promise of the Father.
- Jesus told the disciples that they will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.
- Pentecost is the day that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples.
- The room that all the disciples was sitting in was filled with the blowing sound of violent wind.
- Tongues of fire separated and rested on each of the disciples.
- Each of the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and this enabled them to speak in different languages about Jesus to people.
- The disciples believed that Jesus was the promised Messiah, the Son of God.
- Since that day, people who believe in God have continued to live differently – to live remembering what Jesus taught and what he showed in his own life.

Vocabulary

Passover Festival:

A Jewish festival celebrated every year to remember and celebrate the Exodus of the Israelites.

Easter: Easter Sunday marks Jesus's resurrection. After Jesus was crucified on the Friday his body was taken down from the cross and buried in a cave tomb.

Pentecost: Pentecost is the festival when Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is celebrated on the Sunday 50 days after Easter.

Holy Spirit: The third person of the Trinity; God as spiritually active in the world.

Prayer: Prayer is talking to God. It's telling Him what's going on, asking for help, thanking and praising him and seeking forgiveness.

Mark – Mark is one of the four Gospel Writers.

Holy Week – The events leading up to Jesus' death.

Disciples- The disciples were the students of Jesus. There were 12 disciples who followed and learnt from Jesus.

Messiah – The Jewish community believed Jesus was the Messiah. He was promised by God to save Israel and lead the whole world into eternal peace.

Resurrection: Rising of Christ from the dead.

Ascension: The ascent of Jesus Christ into heaven on the 40th day after his Resurrection
