Shared Reading

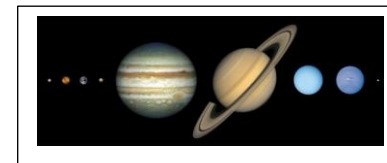
Reading our Summer 1 text 'Wolf Brothers' we will **listen, read, explore, predict, infer, retrieve** and **summarise** the **text** whilst using high quality **vocabulary**.

- To be able to predict and imagine what might happen next in a considered piece of writing
- To be able to retrieve and infer using both teacher modelling but also guided questions
- To be able to summarise what's happened in the text and show good understanding on an individual basis.
- To develop their word knowledge and understanding meaning in different contexts.

Science Astronomy

Key areas of learning learnt in Year 5 are:

- To know that astronomers believe the universe began with the Big Bang, and that it is still expanding today.
- To understand that gravity is a force that holds objects together.
- To know the planets of our Solar System.
- To understand the Moon's phases.
- To understand that the Solar System is just a small part of our universe.



Maths

Children in Year 5 will be covering statistics, shape and position and direction. During maths meetings we will consolidate various topics such as the four operations, time, measurement.

Statistics	Draw/read/interpret line graphs, two-way tables, read and interpret timetables,
Shape	Understand degrees, classify/estimate/measure angles, draw/calculate angles, lengths and angles in shapes, 3-D shapes
Position and direction	Read and plot coordinates, problem solving with coordinates, translation with coordinates, lines of symmetry, reflection in horizontal and vertical lines.

Art & DT Style in Art



This unit explores **style in art**, focusing on how artists use different **techniques** to create unique looks. Students compare brushwork in *Whistlejacket* and *The Scream*, sketch pears in the styles of Van Gogh and Stubbs, and explore **rococo vs. modernism** through painting and design. They finish by creating their own **abstract artwork** using acrylics, applying colour theory and modernist ideas.
