Key areas of learning

We will be learning about how God called and guided His people, beginning with Moses and the prophets, and how the covenant at Sinai shaped the Israelites' identity. They are exploring the Ten Commandments, the importance of trust, obedience, and faithfulness, and how God's promises point forward to Jesus. They are also discovering key virtues such as justice, mercy, and love, and how these guide Christians today in living out God's covenant through love, forgiveness, and service.

Spatial Sense

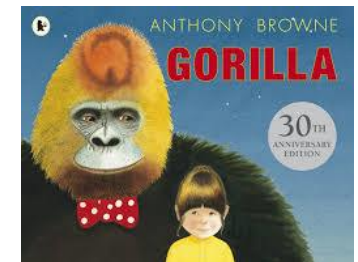
- To understand that map makers draw imaginary lines to divide the world into sectors.

Art & DT Style in Art



This unit explores **style in art**, focusing on how artists use different **techniques** to create unique looks. Students compare brushwork in *Whistlejacket* and *The Scream*, sketch pears in the styles of Van Gogh and Stubbs, and explore **rococo vs. modernism** through painting and design. They finish by creating their own **abstract artwork** using acrylics, applying colour theory and modernist ideas.
