Key areas of learning:

Shared Reading: Voices in the Park

Key areas of learning:

- To be able to predict and imagine what might happen next in a considered piece of writing
- To be able to retrieve and infer using both teacher modelling but also guided questions
- To be able to summarise what's happened in the text and show good understanding on an individual basis

Science: States of Matter

Key areas of learning:

- There are three main states of matter: solid, liquid and gas.
- Evaporation occurs when water turns into gas.
- Condensation occurs when water vapour turns into liquid water (gas into water).
- Precipitation returns water to the surface of the Earth.
- Water changes state within the water cycle.



History: Stuarts

Key areas of learning:

- James VI of Scotland became James I of England and believed in the 'Divine Right of Kings'.
- During the reign of James I there was a plot to blow up the Houses of Parliament (Gunpowder Plot).
- Charles I's decisions led to Civil War.
- The English Civil War lasted for seven years and lots of people died.
- When England did not have a king, Oliver Cromwell led the country as Lord Protector
- Charles II (Charles I's son) was restored to the throne in 1660.

Design and Technology

Key areas of learning:

Cushion	a bag of fabric stuffed with soft material used to lean or sit on, with two sides which are joined by a seam (a cushion can be decorated with appliqué)
fabric	cloth made from threads – clothes are made from fabric
synthetic fabric	fabric which is made from man-made materials, like polyester or nylon
felt	fabric which is made by pressing materials together – felt is often made from wool (a natural fabric)
