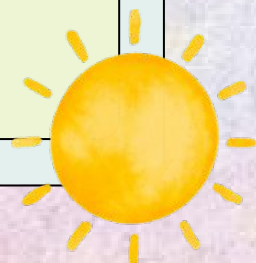
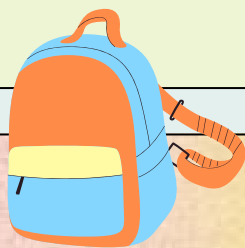
Meanwhile, Year 3 enjoyed a memorable visit to St Paul's Cathedral, bringing their learning to life through this special experience.

The session provided a valuable opportunity to deepen our faith and strengthen our understanding of the Bible and Catholic teaching.

It was especially exciting for our children as Coach Beau, who has supported PE lessons and worked with our Year 5/6 girls’ football team, was part of the successful squad. Year 6 Trip to Army Museum

Year 6 enjoyed an exciting trip to the National Army Museum in Chelsea as part of their World War II History learning. During an interactive workshop on The Blitz, the children shared their knowledge and learnt how the bombing campaign affected people across the United Kingdom. They explored different types of air-raid shelters, including Anderson shelters, discovered how Underground stations were used during the war, and deepened their understanding of evacuees. The children also handled real wartime artefacts and tried on replica items, helping to bring their classroom learning to life.

Year 3 Trip to St Paul's Cathedral

Year 3 had a fantastic visit to St Paul's Cathedral, where they learned about its history, architecture and religious significance with the help of their knowledgeable guide, Terry. The children explored beautiful mosaics depicting the Creation story, discovered areas not usually open to the public, and even saw a staircase featured in famous films.

A highlight of the day was climbing nearly 400 steps to the dome, including the Whispering Gallery and Stone Gallery, where they enjoyed spectacular views of London's famous landmarks.

It was a memorable trip that brought their learning to life.





EYFS Festival at Bute House

Reception had a wonderful time on their trip to Bute House School for the Early Years Festival this week. The children enjoyed a range of exciting hands-on activities, including a science workshop where they explored pushes, pulls, energy and simple chemical reactions. They were fascinated by the experiments and loved making and launching their own rockets. The children also created their own minibeasts, joined in enthusiastically with an interactive storytelling session and had the opportunity to observe and hold a variety of fascinating creatures, including a giant African snail. Throughout the day, the children showed great curiosity, confidence and enthusiasm for learning. The trip also helped them to appreciate the wonder of God's creation and the importance of caring for the natural world. The day ended with a packed lunch and a well-deserved ice cream, leaving everyone with lots of happy memories from a fantastic experience.

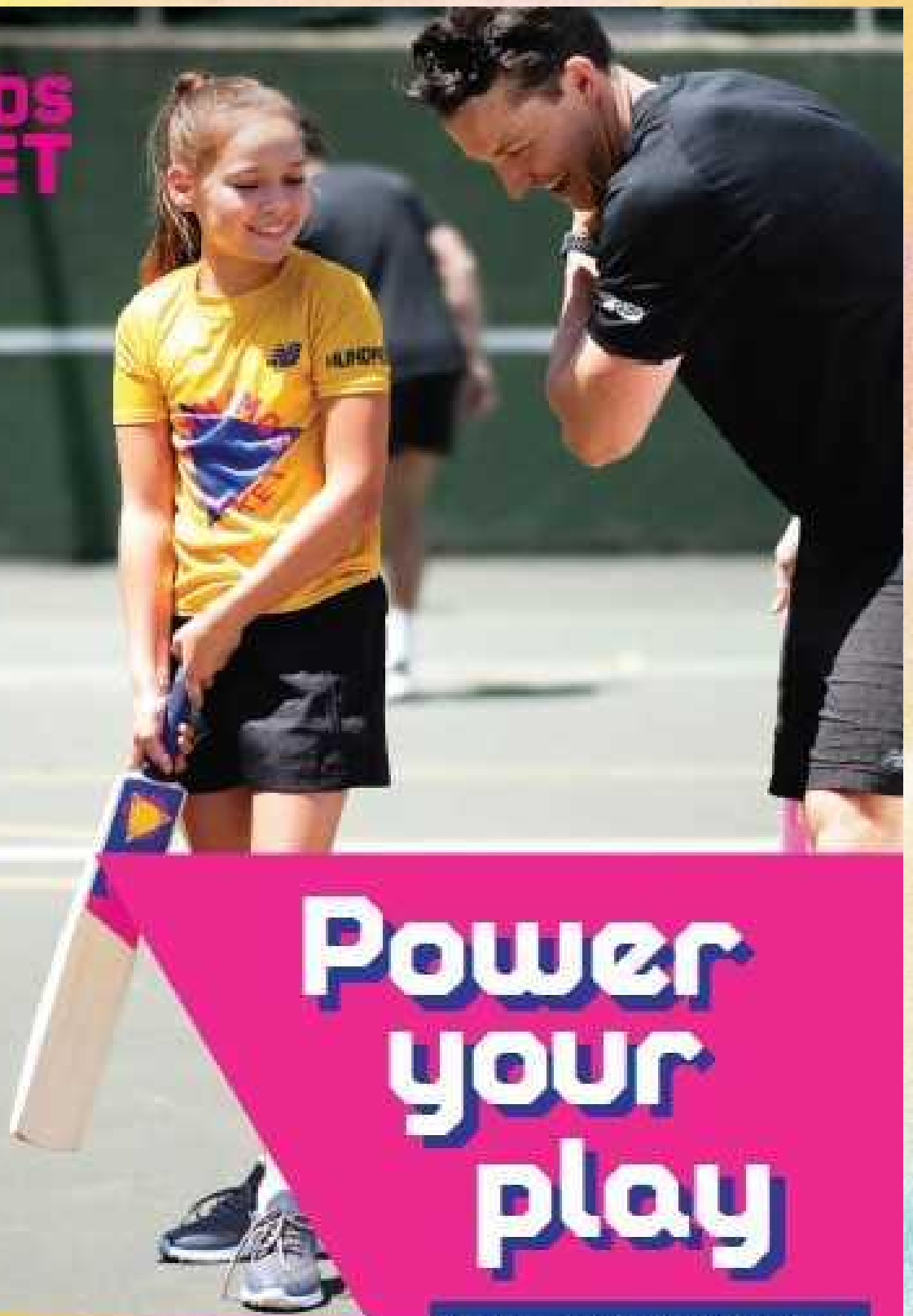
The sessions will run on Monday evenings for 8 weeks and are open to all abilities—whether your child is new to cricket or has played before.

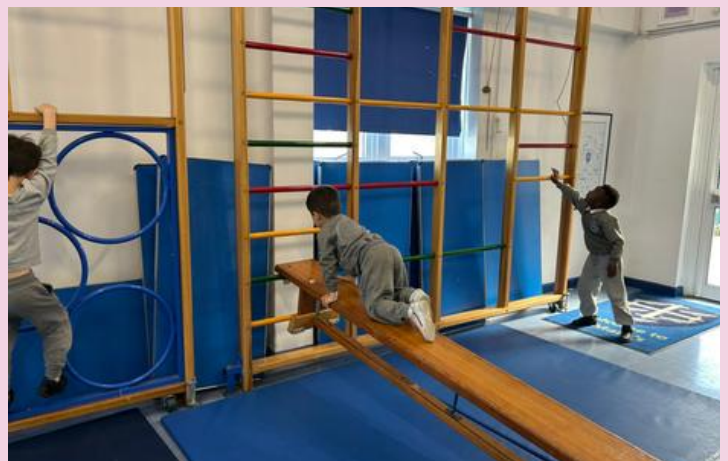


Nursery

What a fantastic week it has been in Nursery! The children were absolute stars in their very first class assembly and impressed everyone with their confidence and enthusiasm. They have also loved exploring the new Supermarket Role Play Corner and serving customers in the Ice Cream Shop by the sand pit. During circle time, the children enjoyed singing their favourite nursery rhymes, and in R.E. they listened to the story of Jesus Meets Zacchaeus, learning about kindness, friendship and how Jesus welcomes everyone.

Reception

Reception have had a fantastic week. A highlight was their visit to Bute House School for the Early Years Festival, where they enjoyed a range of exciting hands-on activities. Back in class, the children learned about Saints Peter and Paul, explored the world of minibeasts, and worked hard in phonics focusing on new digraphs. They also had great fun developing their balance, climbing and yoga skills during gymnastics.



Year 1



In R.E, Year 1 made a paper chain to show the many ways we can be part of Jesus' Church community. We discussed how praying, speaking kindly, helping others and treating everyone with respect are important ways of following in Jesus' footsteps. The children enjoyed sharing their ideas and reflecting on how they can show God's love in their daily lives.

Year 3

In RE, Year 3 explored the links between the First Passover and Jesus' Last Supper. Using their knowledge of both stories, the children compared their similarities and differences before creating beautiful watercolour artwork to illustrate the connections between these important events and deepen their understanding of their significance in the Christian faith.



Year 4

Year 4 thoroughly enjoyed their swimming lesson this week, where they practised important water skills such as floating, gliding and developing their swimming techniques. The children showed great confidence and determination in the pool, and a group of pupils particularly impressed everyone with their fantastic jumps and dives.



Year 5



In Art, Year 5 began an artist study of Henri Matisse, one of the most influential artists of the twentieth century. The children explored his life and work, learning how he used bold colours, simplified shapes and expressive compositions to communicate feelings and emotions. They analysed several of his famous artworks, discussing the mood and impact of each piece, before creating their own careful copies inspired by Matisse's distinctive style.

Year 6 enjoyed an immersive art afternoon this week as part of their study of Impressionism.

They learned about famous artists including Claude Monet, Edgar Degas and Pierre-Auguste Renoir before trying their own en plein air painting, a technique used by Impressionist artists to capture scenes from real life outdoors. The children thoroughly enjoyed creating their own artwork inspired by these famous painters.
