This Year our PLPS team has been working with School council at St Mary's. Having fortnightly meetings tasked with coming up with new fundraising ideas, making key decisions such as Lunch time food options and helping the school advertise the summer fair by creating posters.

All of the school council representatives took their roles and responsibilities seriously and were very professional in representing the school and making key decisions.





House Captains

This year Fulham Foundation has been working with the House captains, taking part in fortnightly meetings and training days designed to coach the house captains in planning and setting up games for lunch times and maintaining the PE shed and sports equipment so they can be used all year round.

Your School Deliverables

Coach Jordan has worked with numerous pupils both 1-2-1 and in groups delivering maths interventions. Predominantly in Year 5, these sessions were designed to support pupils who needed added help in a particular topic. These sessions were successful and many of the pupils had really positive feedback.

One of the most successful things to come out of this year are the girls extra-curricular clubs. St Mary's have seen a massive increase in the amount of girls playing football, a main reason to this has been the introduction to a lunch time girls-only club. This opportunity has allowed girls from all year groups to come together and play football. As a result, the girls football team had a record number of girls trying out for the team this year with over 20 girls wanting to represent the school, which is an amazing thing to see.

Mentoring

Fulham Foundation has supported a number of pupils in delivering 1-2-1 mentoring sessions. With pupils from different year groups, coach Jordan has been able to help them throughout school life. From helping pupils with their classroom behaviour to supporting them in their school work. Fulham Foundation have played a part in developing the skills and characteristics of many pupils at St Mary's this academic year.

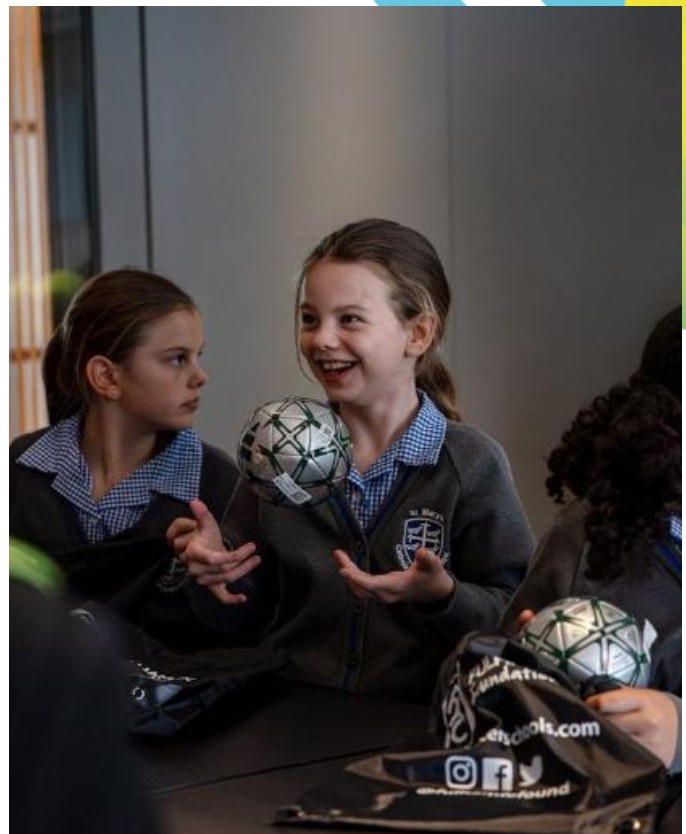
