Lesson 1:	<p>LO: To begin to understand life in Ancient Greece.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can name some of the city-states of Ancient Greece. I can write a fact about each city- state.</p>
Lesson 2:	<p>LO: To understand how democracy in Athens worked.</p> <p>Success criteria: I understand who the 'Boule' were and how they were important. I understand that members of the Boule often gave speeches to Athenian citizens on the 'Pnyx'.</p>
Lesson 3:	<p>LO: To understand why Spartans were famous for being great warriors.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can write about what it was like to be a Spartan boy. I can describe how I would feel if I was a Spartan boy.</p>
Lesson 4:	<p>LO: To know what the Persian Wars were, and what caused them.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can explain that the Persians conquered Ionia I can write about how the people of Ionia felt about it</p>
Lesson 5:	<p>LO: To know what the Persian Wars were, and why the battles of Marathon and Thermopile are still remembered today.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can explain what happened at the battle. I have said when and where the battle took place. I have written about who was involved in the battle and who won.</p>
Lesson 6: Assessment	<p>LO: To know that there was an ancient civilisation referred to as 'Ancient Greece' that existed many years ago.</p> <p>Success criteria: I know that Ancient Greece was made up of city- states I know that the Persian Empire tried to invade Ancient Greece, reuniting some of the city-states in their fight against the Persian Emperor I know that Athens was the birthplace of democracy I know that Sparta is famous for its warriors I know that there were two famous battles that took place between the Greeks and the Persians.</p>

	Spring 2 - Baghdad 900AD
Lesson 1:	<p>LO: To understand that an ancient civilisation began in Mesopotamia.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can explain the reasons why people chose to live in Mesopotamia. I can explain that the Tigris and the Euphrates rivers flood, creating fertile land. I can explain that some ancient civilisation began in Mesopotamia</p>
Lesson 2:	<p>LO: To know that Baghdad is a city that was built near the Tigris River, in Mesopotamia, a long time ago.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can use persuasive language. I can explain Caliph Al Mansur's vision. I can explain why people should come and visit.</p>
Lesson 3:	<p>LO: To understand the layout of Baghdad in 900 CE.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can draw an aerial view of the city of Baghdad I can create a key to show the landmarks in Baghdad I can write a description of the city of Baghdad</p>
Lesson 4:	<p>LO: To understand that many people came to Baghdad from around the world to trade, teach and learn.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can explain that in CE 900 people came from all over the world to learn in Baghdad I can explain what took place at the House of Wisdom. I can explain why the House of Wisdom was such an important place.</p>
Lesson 5:	<p>LO: To know that the Mongol attack on Baghdad destroyed the city.</p> <p>Success criteria: I can explain that the Mongols attacked Baghdad in 1258. I can explain that the Mongols destroyed the city and killed its inhabitants. I can explain that thousands of books were thrown into the Tigris River and lost forever</p>
Lesson 6: Assessment	<p>LO: To understand the significance of Baghdad 900 CE and recall facts about what the city was like in the past</p> <p>Success criteria: I can explain that Baghdad is a city that was built a long time ago in Mesopotamia. I can explain that lots of people came to Baghdad to trade and to study. I can explain that Baghdad was invaded in 1258 and much of the city was destroyed.</p>

Lesson 3:	<p>LO: To know that Napoleon was a French military leader who seized power in France following the French Revolution</p> <p>Success criteria:</p> <p>I can write key facts about Napoleons personal and political life.</p> <p>I understand that Napoleon made himself 'Emperor' of France.</p> <p>I understand that Napoleon created the Bank of France and established new laws with the Code Napoleon.</p>
Lesson 4:	<p>LO: To know that the British Navy and the French Navy fought the Battle of Trafalgar.</p> <p>Success criteria:</p> <p>I can explain what happened at the Battle of Trafalgar</p> <p>I can use technical vocabulary to describe what happened</p> <p>I can explain that the leader of the British Navy, Admiral Nelson, was killed during the battle.</p>
Lesson 5:	<p>LO: To know that Napoleon was exiled twice as punishment for trying to gain power.</p> <p>Success criteria:</p> <p>I can explain what exile is.</p> <p>I can explain how the location of the two places Napoleon was exiled are different.</p> <p>I can explain how the things Napoleon did during exile were different.</p>
